


Why Now?

- SEPTA Forward all working together towards a more fully integrated network serving a wide variety of trips
- SEPTA has never looked at its network comprehensively before
- Between 2013 & 2019 – ridership dropped 13% but operating costs went up 10%
- Elimination of transfer penalty in 2020 offers opportunity to rethink how people can use the system
- Bus ridership is 30-40% below pre-COVID levels




Introducing the Draft Bus Network

SEPTA's Draft Bus Network: Strategic Approach




- **More frequent bus service** - all day, every day

- **More consistent schedules**

- Straighter, more **direct bus routes**

- **Better connections** to other SEPTA services

Overall fewer routes


Straighter lines

Understanding the MAX Series

- The Bus Revolution uses the “MAX series” to talk about bus routes.
- MAX means the maximum time between buses. For example, a 10 MAX route will arrive at least every 10 minutes.
- All bus routes are described as:
 - 10 MAX
 - 15 MAX
 - 30 MAX
 - 60 MAX

} **Frequent Bus Service**

	10 MAX		Metro
	15 MAX		Trolley
	30 MAX		Regional Rail
	60 MAX		Microtransit Zone

Bus Revolution defines a “frequent” bus route as one that **operates every 15 minutes or better.**

Highlights


- Most routes have all-day frequent service, 7 days/week
- Consistent schedules throughout the day
- Additional connections to North and South Phila. and other neighborhoods
- Simplified and straighter alignments
- Consolidated service on some streets

Major Changes

- **10 MAX 511**
 - Combines parts of Routes 40 and 42 via Spruce Street and South Street Bridge
- **15 MAX 515**
 - Combines parts of Routes 30 and 43 via Vine Street, Haverford Avenue and Spring Garden Street
- **15 MAX 508**
 - More frequent service between University City, Mantua and Wissahickon TC
 - Combines parts of Routes 38 and 40 via Belmont Avenue and 40th Street



Look up your bus route to see if it's changed. These information sheets show any proposed changes to each specific route, frequency, or schedule.




